**DICK HEIL – LITTLE ROCK, AR**

Dick has been the main person behind the growth of the Little Rock Duplicate Bridge Club (LRDBC) and Unit 161. Dick is a certified Two-Star Instructor and certified Easybridge Presenter. He has taught over 500 students in the last 5 years. He was recognized as an ACBL Star Recruiter in 2010, having been directly or indirectly responsible for the addition of over 100 new members to the LRDBC and ACBL. He has served on the Board of the LRDBC and as its President 2006 – 2009. Dick is currently serving as District 10's Educational Liaison. He initiated and has worked tirelessly to promote an annual 299er Tournament in Arkansas for duplicate bridge. Dick's enthusiasm and spirit of Goodwill has been an inspiration to all who know him.

**SUZANNE CLIFF – NEW ORLEANS, LA**

Suzanne came to the New Orleans Club about 20 years ago as a beginning player and quickly became involved.
