President's Welcome

The meeting was called to order by David Siebert, President of District 10 at 8am.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes of the last meeting were distributed by Judy Knox. The Board of Directors minutes from the meeting in Biloxi, MS on February 5, 2011 were approved. Name badges were given to all District 10 Delegates. Delegates were asked to let the Secretary know if they did not receive a name badge or if the name badge was incorrect. Tournament Coordinator Report - Charles MacCracken

Charlie discussed the following topics:

- District 10 runs 3 STAC games per year. The run 2 of them on their own and piggy back with District 7 in December. To return the favor, they piggy back with us on our first STAC of the year.
- District 10 STAC with District 7 District 7 does not want the STAC in January or February. That is why the STAC was held on Easter weekend last year. However, due to a lot of complaints from District 10 units, the STAC that was held on Easter weekend last year will now be held in late January or early February of 2012.
- > We will continue to have the District 10 STAC with District 7 in December.
- Tunica Tournament- This year's schedule is a major change. Results are in and the table count is down. We are not sure if it is the schedule or if it is the fact that Gambling may have lost its luster. Charlie provided the following Table Count numbers:

2007 = 2200 2008 = 2100 2009 = 2000 2010 = 1888 2011 = 1800 (a little over)

Bill Cook's Report

Bill Cook is the district 10 representative to the ACBL Board of Directors. His report covered the ACBL Board of Directors meeting held in Toronto, Ontario, Canada on July 18 – 21, 2011. A proposed plan to modify the Master point award schedule for pair events at sectional and regional tournaments based on Strength of Field (SOF) was presented to the ACBL Board by the task force who had been assigned the responsibility of making a recommendation. The plan was adopted (first reading) but is subject to being changed before it is voted on a second time in Seattle. I am attaching a copy of the proposed plan and request that you review it and send me your comments and /or proposed changes so that I may attempt to get the plan modified in Seattle.

Defeated by a vote of 15-10, a motion to make player conduce and /or misconduct at any ACBL club subject to enforcement of the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations (CDR) by Units, District or the ACBL. I voted against the motion because clubs are not a part of the official organizational structure of ACBL. They are independently owned and operated and in most cases operate on a "for profit" basis which conflicts with ACBL as a non-profit organization. ACBL issues sanctions to clubs to conduct bridge games in accordance with the rules of bridge. However, the club owner has complete responsibility for running the club and disciplining players. (See exhibit A attached for a copy of the report)

A motion was made by Coley McGinnis to provide Bill Cook with \$1500 for welcoming packages to the ACBL Board Members at the NABC in Memphis in 2012. The motion passed.

NAP/GNT/STaC Coordinator Report - Russ Jones

Russ gave his report. This last year we had the highest participation in the NAP games. We have won every year but 1. District 10 wins hands down year after year. All of our teams went to the nationals. We appreciate all clubs for having these qualifying games. You should be having your Unit qualifying games now until the end of the year. GNT games are having a problem. We are not happy with the participation. Now there is a push to run the GNTs the same as the NAP games. For NAP games \$4.00 per table goes to ACBL. GNTs are run the way the District wants to. They charge whatever they want for table fees. There is never enough money. Our numbers are up. We almost doubled flight A and B and our numbers are growing. Russ recommends that each Unit in District 10 raise the sanction table fees for GNT games from \$7.00 to \$10.00. This will be collected at unit qualifying games at the District finals.

Coley McGinnis made a motion to increase table fees by \$10 for GNT games. It was seconded by Ruth Singletary. The motion passed. (See Exhibit B attached for a copy of Russ' report.)

Treasurer's Report - Lynne Logan

Lynne Logan, District 10 Treasurer gave the Treasurer's report for 2011We have net income of \$8,896.73. Lynne walked us through all of the financial reports. See Exhibit "C" which is attached for a copy of Lynne's report.)

Webmaster Report - Don Kemp

Don Kemp is the District 10 Webmaster. He stated that Bill Cook's Report on the ACBL Director's Meeting is on the District 10 web page. Don is also posting tournament results on the District 10 web page. Tell directors to send them in to him. He can also post partial Tournament results and hand records. David Seibert asked if there have been any complaints about the fact that we have stopped mailing out the Forum News letter. Don said there was one complaint. Don can also post anything that is of special interest to your area on the District 10 web page. It would be helpful if you would put the District web site on any advertisements you have. The District 10 website address is D10bridge.org. Don can post game results and hand records in pdf format. Tournament Chairs can post tournament schedules on D10 web page if they send it to Don in pdf. How to get Board members updated. Just send Don an email if anything needs to be updated. Don't wait 6 months to notify Don.

Education Liaison - Dick Heil

Dick Heil gave his report. We have had 4 requests for reimbursements, 3 from unit 161 and 1 from unit 157. People are not aware of the D10 education reimbursement policy. Dick will send out an email to every District 10 Unit president and tell them what our educational reimbursement policy is. We match the Units up to \$1,000 per club per year up to a maximum of \$10,000. The Education Liaison must submit a report with a detail listing of all submissions and reimbursements at the District 10 meetings each year. If the Education Liaison cannot attend the meeting they must submit the required report in writing to be handed out at the meeting. The report should be emailed to the Secretary for inclusion in the minutes each year.

A motion was made by Dick Heil for District 10 to reimburse Unit 180 for half of the \$715 expense for advertising to cover the administrative error of \$390. The motion passed.

Tournament Oversight Committee- Chuck Wilkinson, Coley McGinnis, Don Kern

Chuck said for 2012 we have approved the schedule for Biloxi and the Hot Springs Birmingham split. We have approved the Hot Springs budget and schedule. We have not received the Birmingham schedule or budget yet. We have approved the schedule for Tunica, but not the budget. We have to review and approve the schedules and budgets for all regionals before they go to ACBL. There are guidelines for the Tournament Chairs on the D-10 web page for preparing and submitting schedules and budgets.

Status Report on NABC 2012 - Cecile Skaggs

Cecile introduced Don Paterson, NABC Tournament co-chair. We are a year and a half behind schedule on preparing for this Tournament. This has cost us in financial support. Cecile sent 120 letters to all District 10 clubs. She has only heard from 4 clubs in the District. If 15 clubs in the District can contribute \$100, we can have a District 10 club day at the NABC in 2012. Henry Francis sent out letters to collect money in Sue Emery's memory. We got a lot of contributions for Sue Emery thanks to Henry Francis. People in Memphis have had dinners to raise money for the NABC. We have had raffles and one woman is making a quilt to raise money for the NABC.

299er Discussion

Is District 10 supposed to give money to the units to have a 299er free luncheon or party? District 10 does not have to approve this. This is automatically included in the Unit's budget for all regional tournaments. When the Oversight Committee approves the budget for each regional, there is supposed to be a line item in the budget for a free luncheon for all 299ers. The cost of the luncheon is covered by the tournament.

Discussion on ending Split Regionals

Do we need to end split regionals? There was much discussion on this topic. The Nashville and Baton Rouge Split regional really works. The only split regional we have now is Mobile and Shreveport. There was a discussion of just having a regional in Mobile by itself and end the split regional. It is scheduled for 4 years from now. We decided to table the discussion on split regionals for another meeting.

The Panhandle of Florida wants to become part of Unit 10. They need us to promise them a Regional every other year. It is in the same area as Mobile and Shreveport. They have expressed interest. They have to make application to District 9 to leave that District and join District 10. Then District 10 would have to approve for them to join District 10. We decided to table this discussion to the next D10 meeting.

Discussion on the new Schedule at Tunica -10am and 2:30pm start dates for major games. We have 3 years to approve this schedule. A lot of people have complained and a lot have said they like the new schedule. We will try this for 3 years and if it doesn't work after that, we will go back to the original time.

There being no other business to discuss, a motion was made by Lynne Logan to adjourn and seconded by Cecile Skaggs. The meeting was adjourned.

ACBL BOARD OF DIRECTOR'S MEETING TORONTO, ONTARIO, CANADA JULY 18, 2011 THROUGH JULY 21, 2011

REPORT FROM BILL COOK, JR. DISTRICT 10 REPRESENTATIVE

The following actions were taken by the Board:

- Defeated by a vote of 15 10, a motion to make player conduct and/or misconduct at any ACBL club subject to enforcement of the ACBL Code of Disciplinary Regulations (CDR) by Units, Districts or the ACBL. I voted against the motion because clubs are not a part of the official organizational structure of ACBL. They are independently owned and operated and in most cases operate on a "for profit" basis which conflicts with ACBL as a non-profit organization. ACBL issues sanctions to clubs to conduct bridge games in accordance with the rules of bridge. However, the club owner has complete responsibility for running the club and disciplining players.
- A proposed plan to modify the Masterpoint Award schedule for pair events at sectional and regional tournaments based on Strength of Field (SOF) was presented to the Board by the task force who had been assigned the responsibility of making a recommendation. The plan was adopted (first reading) but is subject to being changed before it is voted on a second time in Seattle. I am attaching a copy of the proposed plan and request that you review it and send me your comments and/or proposed changes so that I may attempt to get the plan modified in Seattle.
- Approved a motion for a task force to recommend strategies to raise the National Charity Committee to a similar level of recognition as the ACBL Aileen Osofsky Goodwill Committee.
- Approved starting time of 10:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. for the NABC events at the 2013 summer NABC in Atlanta.
- Approved (First Reading) changes in Masterpoint Awards for NABC Championships as follows:
 - I. Open Pairs (no other events, four sessions) changed from 130 to 125.

Red Ribbon Pairs changed from 70 to 60.

Canadian Open Pairs Championships changed from 75 to 65.

Women's KO Teams changed from 140 to 120.

US Women's Bridge Championship changed from 140 to 120.

Senior Team Trials changed from 50 to 120.

<u>Canadian Senior Team Championships</u> changed to 60 Masterpoints instead of being computed by the general formula.

<u>Super Senior Pairs</u> changed to 50 Masterpoints instead of being computed by the general formula.

<u>Senior Mixed Pairs (new)</u> – An initial award of 60 Masterpoints for Seattle, to be reviewed.

II. The Reduction Factor for 18 board games is changed from 80% to 67%.

The maximum number of boards for a club game not restricted by Masterpoints is changed from 18 to 20 boards (the tournament minimum is 21). Also, the Reduction Factor for clubs (and online) games not restricted by Masterpoints of fewer than 20 boards will be 60%. Currently, the minimum for club games receiving a full award is 18 boards and the Reduction Factor is 80%.


- Approved changing the name of the Ace of Clubs Race to the Helen Shanbrom Ace of Clubs Race.
- Defeated a motion to waive all entry fees for the NABC final GNT events.
- Approved a modification to Correction and Appeal Periods of the General Conditions of Contest for knockout teams that empowers the DIC, when practical, to make score corrections before the announced starting time of the next match in the interest of fairness/equity.
- Defeated a motion to change the Grand National Teams Conditions of Contest to allow the average of the top 4 players to be less than 5000 in Flight A and less than 2000 in Flight B.
- Approved the 2011-2012 GNT Conditions of Contest which permits that Districts may elect to hold GNT finals at multiple sites with competition via the internet.
- Approved support for a World Bridge Series Championship in North America in 2018 and authorized a \$100,000 payment by ACBL in support of the championship provided no title sponsor(s) pays \$300,000 or more in support of the championship.
- Modified the Code of Disciplinary Regulations (CDR) to permit ACBL management to impose an administrative suspension on a person that has caused damage to any facility associated with an ACBL Tournament during the conduct of such tournament without adequate reason or justification and failed to make reasonable compensation therefore.
- Defeated a motion to modify the CDR to allow attorneys to be present and represent the parties at hearings before the Appeals and Changes Committee of the Board of Directors.
- Approved a motion that permits a person to serve as President or Chairman of the Board of Directors of ACBL only if they are serving as a member of the Board of Directors.


- Rescinded a motion that required management to distribute the first \$50,000 collected annually from Junior Fund games to the USBF to fund Junior Team activities.
- Defeated a motion to allow Unit 461, Nevada County, to transfer from District 20 to District 21.
- Approved a motion that prohibits non-participating children under the age of six and pets from remaining in the playing area of NABC tournaments during play and for 15 minutes before and after play subject to certain exceptions and restrictions involving working service dogs ("WSD") and emotional support animals ("ESA").
- Modified the General Conditions of Contest Swiss Teams Player Errors to read "No increase in score need be granted unless the Director's attention is called to the error prior to the announced starting time of the next match or thirty minutes after the completion of the match, whichever is earlier".

JAY BAUM, ACBL CEO REPORTED THE FOLLOWING:

- Through June ACBL membership was 165,245. New members for the first six months of 2011 were 6,283 (an increase of 7.5% over 2010).
- The Club Manager's Handbook has been updated and is available on the ACBL website.
- The Unit Membership Chair Handbook has been updated and is also available on our website.
- The 7th Edition of the Official Encyclopedia of Bridge is on schedule for completion and is expected to be available for sale soon.
- All tournament total tables for 2011 are running close to flat vs. 2010, but expect to finish
 the year with total tables per tournament close to / or exceeding 2010.
- Finances are in good shape with cash and investments totaling \$6,624,000.
- Income and expenses are under budget by \$449,367 net for the first six months due primarily to lower utility bills, professional services, supplies and salaries for unfilled positions.
- A new marketing brochure has been completed and copies are available for club/teachers. It provides an overview of ACBL and the Game of Bridge.

- Marketing has, since the 2011 Spring Board meeting, produced 15 press releases and articles and submitted to media.
- The Co-operative Advertising program continues to be successful and popular for clubs and teachers in their effort to recruit beginner/newcomer players. Year-to-date, ACBL has subsidized advertising costs for 168 beginner/newcomer ad campaigns submitted by clubs and teachers totaling \$73,630.51.
- ACBL continues to take advantage of marketing opportunities offered via the website, social and mobile media platforms.
- Plans are being made for ACBL to attend and exhibit at the AARP Trade Show September,
 2011 in Los Angeles, CA. Over 25,000 retirees are expected to attend.
- Audrey Grant has been engaged to develop programs for ACBL that will reach the social bridge player and convert them into duplicate players.
- As of June 17, 2011, a total of 174 School Bridge classes were conducted during Spring, 2011 with a total of 1,283 graduates.
- ACBL will attend and exhibit at the National Council of Teachers of Math (NCTM) October meeting in St. Louis, MO. This will allow ACBL an opportunity to promote its School Bridge Lessons Series to a highly targeted audience of math teachers.





Strength of Field Award System

Sectional & Sectional

Pairs and Swiss Team Games

The Current Masterpoint System

First Overall = $B \times R \times S \times M \times P \times T$

- B = Table Count Factor [(tables + 10)/60) for less than 60 tables
- = Classification Factor (Sectional = 10, Regional =14)
- = Sessions Factor [0.5x (sessions+1)]
- = Upper Masterpoint Limit Strength factor (100mp = 0.5, 750mp = .7, UNL = 1)
- = Restriction Factor (None = 1, One = 0.8, Two or more = 0.7)
- = Type of Game Factor (BAM = 1.1, Individual = 0.75)

Table Count is the Dominating Factor

Large, weak fields receive awards that are too large relative to smaller strong fields.

e.g. A 60 table 99er game pays the same award as a 20 table LM game.

Table counting has become a creative process due to the multiplicity of events.

"A" Flights continue to shrink as we raise the limits for the "B" Flights.

Open Pairs games are shrinking because awards for limited games are not significantly lower.

M-Factor is out-dated

Expanded use of flighting and strata-flighting causes distortion.

Strength of a flight is more heavily dependent on lower limit (top of flight below).

Masterpoint inflation has antiquated these values.

T-Factor serves no real purpose

Individual events are virtually nonexistent and BAM are rare.

If these events are truly weaker or stronger, an SOF based formula will compensate

Criteria for the SOF Award System

Measurement of Field Strength

Individual masterpoint holdings must be capped to eliminate distortions in small fields. Masterpoint Caps used are 20,000 per pair or 40,000 per four-man team. Average Masterpoint Holdings are our best measure of field strength.

Table Count Measurement

Only 5% of these events reached the 60 table mark which was selected as a maximum size. The median size of 1513 two-session Regional events played in 2010 was 22 tables. SOF awards should be based on a combination of field strength and table count. Only tables actually in an event should be counted,

Relationship to Knockout SOF Formula

These values suggest a two-session award range of 3.6 to 39 masterpoints for an equivalent (32 table) pair We have an established relationship between two-session and four-session awards (1.5/2.5 = 60%). The Knockout SOF award method has been implemented successfully and proven for several years. Regional four-session KO awards range from 6 to 65 masterpoints for a 16 team bracket.

Aggregate SOF Awards should equal Current Aggregate Awards

Overall, SOF awards should produce minimal masterpoint inflation or deflation. SOF awards are tested against a database of all 2010 events.

Established Relationships should be maintained

P-Factor (Restrictions) should be unchanged. R-Factor (Classifications) should be unchanged. S-Factor (Sessions) should be unchanged.

SOF - Genesis of the Formula

- The Maximum Award (50 MP) is attained for 60 Tables with a 6200 MP Average.
- approximate our current awards for all game Awards for fields with a 1,250 MP Average sizes. This is the strength of a typical Open Pairs/Swiss game.
- Awards for large games with a MP Average of 250 would be approximately 12 MP.
- Very small weak games will pay 2.50 MP. This is the current award for an 8 table 299er game.

For Average Masterpoints <= 1,250

$$AWARD = 1.000s + 2.250 + (T/60) (12.158 s + 6.461)$$

For Average Masterpoints >= 1,250

$$AWARD = 2.000s + 1.000 + (T/60) (3.130s + 17.087)$$

Where: s= Average Masterpoints/1000 per player subject to a 20, 000 limit per pair

And:

T=Tables subject to a maximum of 60

Average Masterpoints are based on the highest 120 pairs

Minimum Award = 2.50 Masterpoints

Maximum Award = 50 Masterpoints

Adjustments to Basic Formula

- The top "A" Stratum of a Stratified Event will pay a minimum of 110% of the standalone award calculated for that Stratum.
- Awards for Stand-alone Flight A events are 110% of the basic formula value.
- Team event will be increased by 0.1 x (s-1.25) if the average masterpoint holding is 1250 or Awards for any bracket of a bracketed Swiss greater.


Session Awards

- The 1st Place Award will be 50% of the onesession award for the table count in the comparison.
- SOF will not be calculated for individua sections.
- Depth of Session Awards will be the same as in the current system.

SOF vs. Current Awards - Commentary 2010 Two-Session Regional Events

- This table which follows is a Summary Comparison of SOF awards to actual awards for all 2010 two-session Regional events.
- These comparisons demonstrate that we have a formula that closely reproduces the 2010 award levels, in the aggregate and for segregated groups of games. The SOF methodology is designed to stand us in good stead going forward.
- Total masterpoints that would have been awarded under the SOF formula are less than 5% below 2010 levels. The continuing growth of our members' masterpoint holdings will result in 2012 award levels being at the desired level..
- Top Strata awards increased for unlimited games and decreased for limited games. This demonstrates the fairness aspect of the SOF formula. The large (41+ tables) 0-750 games have average masterpoint values in the 250 range. The awards for these games decreased from an average award of 15.98 under the current system to an award of 11.20 under SOF.
- While the primary component of the new system is SOF, table count is not ignored. SOF properly ignores the table count or other extraneous events being conducted concurrently. This method will not fail us when we invent new events or reconstruct levels for strata or
